Court: Brief facts.

The accused and another still at large on the 19/3/2018 illegally entered and got with him devices capable of killing and injuring protected wildlife species in the area of Lagazi within Murchison falls protected area.

The accused killed one male Uganda kob, when arrested, accused was found with one spear, one wheel trap. He was arrested and taken to Nwoya central police station and charged accordingly.

Accused: The facts are true as stated by prosecution.

Court: Accused is convicted on his own plea of guilt.

Pros: The convict is a first offender with no record of previous conviction, he pleaded guilty therefore he did not waste court's time. However the offences of wildlife are so rampant and



if not controlled those wildlife species will be extinct, the convict killed one Uganda Kob, he was found in possession of a dangerous materials, thereby I pray for a custodial sentences so as to send a strong message to would be offenders.

Convict in Mitigation: I am a first offender, and I pray for leniency from court and I promised not to commit the offences again. I am a sole bread winner for 13 children whom some of them are HIV/AIDS positive, I am also a widower and I take care of my old mother who is diabetic. I am requesting court to give me a non custodial sentence so take care of my children.

Court sentence: The convict is a first offender with no known past criminal record, he pleaded guilty to the charges thus saving court's time and resources, he has asked court for leniency a sign that he is remorseful.



He has told court he is a sole bread winner for his 13 orphaned children and an old diabetic mother and further that he is a widower, however the offences relating to wildlife is on increase and there is need to save the wildlife since it is a contributor to the country's economy. Thus in consideration of the above, the convict is sentenced to on;

1. Count one, to one year imprisonment.
2. Count two, to imprisonment for one year.
3. Count three to imprisonment for two years.
